





Michael Harding's Sussex heifer 235p and making £1198.50. James Seller has his Sussex steer, also 235p and nearly £1340 - all very creditable. 

Local Abbattoirs R Key (LARK)

LARK is a farmer/producer led group that was set up in response to the closure of Tottingworth abattoir, with the following objectives:

- To investigate options for replacing lost abattoir capacity in the Tottingworth catchment area
- To support the All Party Parliamentary Group for Animal Welfare (APGAW)
 which has been driving the need for a change in the way regulations are
 applied to small abattoirs*
- To consider mid-term options (1 to 2 years) for supporting abattoir capacity including upgrading existing/introducing state of the art, high welfare, abattoirs

We will support APGAW to show stakeholder groups including MPs, DEFRA and the FSA, that local abattoirs are crucial to local livestock farms. The loss of these and the subsequent reliance on much larger units will:

- impact on food security,
- the objective of producing local food that reduces food miles, & guarantees animal welfare, and
- meets enhanced environmental standards.

How can you help?

Evidence of how Tottingworth's closure will impact your business is the best way to demonstrate this. Please complete the attached questionnaire and return it to quymacnauqhton@qmail.com. This information will be presented to the next APGAW meeting at the end of November.

When we know the date of the AGPAW meeting we will send a circular out with the contact details of your MP encouraging you to write to them to ask them to support AGPAW's work and to attend the meeting.

"The FSA acknowledges that the present one size fits all system does not work and needs to move to a more risk-based approach to the application of the regulations which would reduce the level of bureaucracy imposed on small abattoirs. However, this will require legislative change to have any chance of a meaningful impact. The refusal from the UK Government to utilise even existing legislation to support small abattoirs means that in the meantime many, like my own, will have no choice but to close."
